Guest Speaker

Herbert S. Newman, FAIA

Principal

Herbert Newman was born in New York City in 1934. After receiving his Bachelor of Arts in American Civilization from Brown University in 1955, he attended the Yale University School of Architecture. Upon receiving his Master of Architecture from Yale in 1959, he was awarded the Eero Saarinen Traveling Fellowship for Academic Excellence.

Since establishing his own architectural practice in 1964, Mr. Newman has been the campus planning consultant for Yale University and Visiting Critic and Associate Professor (Adjunct) of Design at the Yale University School of Architecture.

Throughout his years in New Haven, Herbert Newman's contributions to the fabric of the city include the restored and expanded City Hall, the award winning restorations of Union Station, Yale University Law School Library, Battell Chapel, and the Yale Center for American Arts. A catalyst for urban renewal with the development of projects like Chapel Square Mall, Science Park, Ninth Square, Downtown South/Hill North, the Arts Center District, the Dixwell Community Center, the revitalized Broadway District, and as a special advisor to the Department of Transportation on the restoration of the historic Merritt Parkway, Mr. Newman has helped define a new level of Yale-New Haven partnerships. He is actively engaged in educational, civic, and philanthropic works.

He has created an extensive portfolio of library projects. The National American Institute of Architects Awards for Design Excellence awarded two of these projects, Dana Addition to Case Library at Colgate University and Sterling Law School Library Renovation at Yale University. In addition to working at Colgate University, and Yale University he has designed libraries for Northeastern University, Williams College, Lynn University and Middlesex Community College. Mr. Newman has also been involved in several public libraries for the towns of Westport, Stamford, and Fairfield; he has also designed media centers for several public schools in New Haven, West Hartford and Windsor.

His work has received over 60 awards for design excellence, including five National American Institute of Architects Awards for Design Excellence, and has been published internationally in *Global Architecture*, *Architektur & Wohnen*, *Casa Vogue*, the *New York Times Magazine*, *Architectural Record*, *Progressive Architecture*, *Architecture Magazine*, *Remodeling Magazine*, *Builder Magazine*, *Interior Environment*, and *Athletic Business*.

Mr. Newman has authored articles for numerous publications, including the *Journal of Architectural Education*, *American School & University*, and *Architecture Magazine*, and has served as Visiting Critic, Juror, and Lecturer at Carnegie-Mellon University, Harvard University, Columbia University, and the University of Tennessee. In 1999 his firm presented the symposium *Architecture in Residence: Enhancing the Quality of Residential Life*.
