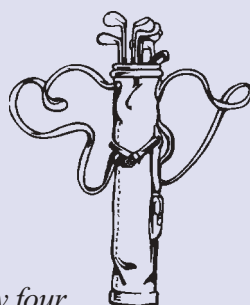

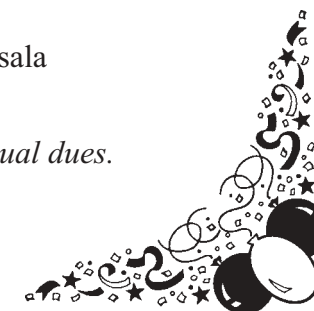

Our Keynote Speaker

Dr. Lawrence J. DeNardis

Dr. Lawrence J. DeNardis was named President of the University of New Haven in 1991. He had previously been both a federal and state legislator, chief executive officer and political science professor. He represented Connecticut's Third Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives (1981-82), after serving five terms in the Connecticut State Senate (1971-79). In addition, he was Acting Assistant Secretary for Legislation at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in 1985-86. DeNardis was appointed by President George Bush to serve as a member of the Board of Regents of the National Library of Medicine (1990-94).

Immediately prior to his appointment as President of the University of New Haven, DeNardis served as President and CEO of the Connecticut Policy and Economic Council (1989-91), and was appointed by former Governor Lowell P. Weicker as Chair of the Connecticut Board of Governors of Higher Education (1991).

Dr. DeNardis' academic experience includes 16 years as Associate Professor and Chairman of the Political Science Department at Albertus Magnus College, Visiting Professor of Government at Connecticut College, Guest Scholar at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars of the Smithsonian Institution, and seminar instructor at Yale University.

Dr. DeNardis earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from the College of Holy Cross, and Master's and Doctoral degrees in Government from New York University.
